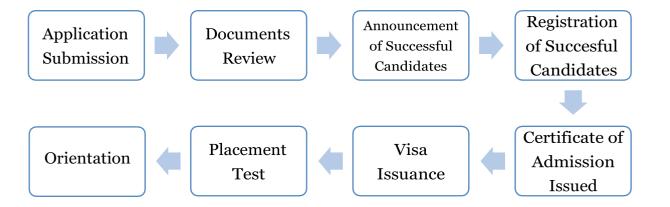

9	Bank Statement (ORIGINAL ONLY)	 ■ In order to apply for Visa in Korean Consulate or Immigration Office, Bank Statement must be acquired. Please understand that the Korean immigration office requires all international students to prove their financial status for their academic sustainability. ■ Bank Statement ① Indicate it has a minimum balance of USD 10,000. ② Be an ORIGINAL document with the stamp [signature] from the bank. ③ The account holder must be you or your parents. If the bank account is not yours, you must submit STATEMENT OF FINANCIAL SPONSORSHIP together, filled out by the bank account holder. ④ Be issued within 1 month from the submission deadline and should be maintained for more than 6 months *You need to freeze your bank account with a minimum balance of USD 10,000 by February 28, 2022 (for Spring 2022) *Exemption Conditions of Bank Statement Submission Only two cases below are possible, No more exemption! ④ If you already have any visa that allows you to stay in Korea for the full required program period.

11	Guarantor Form	 Eligibility: A person who currently resides and works in Jeju Requirements: Copy of guarantor's <u>passport</u> and original copy of <u>Proof of Employment</u> or <u>Business Registration</u> must be included. Relation between the guarantor and the applicant should be stated clearly.

- * Any document in other languages than Korean must be translated in Korean and certified by the translator (no need for notarization)
- * Copies of original documents must be presented with the originals or supported with the original certificate(s) issued by the authorities that retain the originals.
- * If the applicant's name does not match on all documents, he or she must submit official certification to prove that those names are used for the identical person.
- * Changes to admissions applications (i.e. degree, date, etc.) are prohibited after the submission.
- * Application with forged documents or false information will be cancelled.
- * CHU can request to you for additional documents to submit for clear verification.
- * Submitted documents won't be returned.
- * All of the required documents should be submitted to CHU Language Center either via e-mail or postal mail during the designated period, and the address is as below.

- Tuition Fee Payment:
- 1. Regular Course: \$1,200/semester (Monday~Friday, 4 hours/day)

- 3. Transfer must be made under the applicant's name
- If someone other than the applicant is making the transfer (e.g., parents, brother, etc.), please contact the Language Center in advance.
- 4. Transfer fee must be paid by the student, any difference due to exchange rate will be calculated after admission.

Refund Policy:

- 1. Before the term starts: 100% refund
- 2. Before 1/3 of the month: 2/3 for the month and the rest of the term
- 3. After 1/3 but before 1/2 of the month: 1/2 for the month and the rest of the term
- 4. After 1/2 of the month: No refund for the month but full refund for the rest of the term
- 5. Refund applications can be completed at the Language Center. Applicants should bring a copy of bank book, passport, and Alien Registration Card (for holders only).



VI Dormitory Fee

- 1. Korean Language students will generally stay in the University dormitories. Each room has four beds.
- 2. Dormitory Fee: \$480/semester (Food is not included. \$50 deposit is required)
 - The fee can change depending on the length of study.

VII Insurance

- 1. All enrolled students must sign up for private insurance for 6 months after entering Korea.
- 2. Insurance: \$120/6 months
- 3. All students are automatically enrolled in the National Health Insurance after six months on the date of entry.

VIII Visa Application and Immigration

- 1. Visa Application
 - To apply for the Visa, visit your local Korean Embassy with the Visa Issuance Number given by CHU (for 6 months' visa).
- 2. Entering Korea
 - Email your flight itinerary to oia@chu.ac.kr at least 3 days before your flight.
- 3. Joining the Language Program
 - You will have the orientation and placement test upon your arrival
